Lanark County Overview

- Population ~75,000
- 9 Municipalities
 - Small urban, rural region
 - 4 towns > ~6000 12,000
- Carleton Place/ Beckwith/ Mississippi Mills population expected to double in 20 years
- Carleton Place is Canada's fastest growing town for past 4 years
- Upper Canada District School Board and Catholic District School Board of Eastern Ontario



The "5 –year" Journey



 ~2008 Carleton Place Strategic Plan community consultation identified problematic substance use as a municipal issue

- "Why are you thinking so small?"






Started Building a Coalition



- Engaged local service providers, public health, police, schools, municipal officials and community members
- Several community meetings and guidance from experienced elected officials resulted in a proposed network of committees

Looking For A Way To "Do" Prevention

- Carleton Place MDS focussed on awareness building
 - Participated in community events
 - A very brave Mom spoke about 15 year old's suicide at schools.
 - Substance use was a factor
 - A few kids with suicide ideation sought assistance
 - Approach abandoned due to suicide contagion concerns
 - Police officer spoke a multiple fatality, alcohol related highway accident.
- Limited capability to evaluate → "Are we making a difference"
 - Without a clear prevention pathway, momentum waned



January 20, 2020

The first County to implement Planet Youth in Canada



anark County in Ontario became the first county to launch the Planet Youth model for substance-use prevention in youth in Canada . The launch took place on January 20 in Carleton Place.

The Planet Youth Lanark County (PYLC) is collaborating with the Catholic District School Board of Eastern Ontario and the Upper Canada District School Board to conduct student surveys in the English language high schools . Survey reports, for each municipality, will allow communities to understand their own risk and protective factors. The surveys will be conducted among grade 10 students and it's anticipated that those surveys will start to roll out in schools this March .




Lanark County Grade 10 Survey Summary



- Detailed reports \rightarrow www.planetyouthlanark.ca
- High level of Substance Use
- Alcohol access and use at home ۲
- 2024/2025 workplan focus! Participation in organized sport/leisure time activities low
- 67% feel safe at school \rightarrow 33% do not
- 69% do not get enough sleep \rightarrow < 7 hours
 - 2.8 x more likely to report cannabis consumption
 - 2.3 x more likely to report "not happy"
 - Self reported mental and physical health correlates with sleep

Reflections On Our Implementation Journey



- Our 2 year, pandemic induced delay was a major setback. We lost momentum that took significant time to recover.
- Community is not excited by planning, collecting and analyzing data.
 - Easy to jump into "solution space" too early.
- Team members/collaborators/funders can have "dynamic" priorities.
 - Especially when senior leadership changes in an organization
 - Stronger connections would have improved risk management
- It is VERY helpful to learn from other communities.
 - Every time we asked for guidance it was freely provided.
 - I learned a lot at the 2024 Planet Youth conference
 - Very excited by the growing network of Canadian communities



Ontario Perspective on Step 2: Funding





- Ontario's Mental Health and Addictions Centre of Excellence focus is
 - inconsistency in what services are available by region
 - uneven client and family experiences and outcomes
 - lack of data to show where to improve
- Upstream prevention is not a strategic focus for Ontario
- Major philanthropy calls for proposals focus on treatment and system navigation
- About 5% of Canadian health spending is allocated to all prevention
 - Tough environment for "Long-cycle Prevention Funding" (Step 2)
- Very grateful for financial support received to date

- Not everyone is happy when systems are changed.
 - School board led community consultations on modifying bell times to improve adolescent sleep health
 - Avoiding early morning sports and other extra-curricular activities
- Misconceptions
 - Curfews : A common question in introductory IPM conversations
- Misinformation → Polarization
 - Our community is dealing with a recent homicide of a youth
 - Groundswell of supportive conversation
 - But also disturbing, hateful speech and activities




- 2nd cycle of Steps 4 through 10
